Cellist Katy Bell and violinist Emma Donald came together in St Giles Parish Church in Marchmont, Edinburgh to play the two most outstanding duos for violin and cello - those by Ravel and Kodaly. I have heard the two works individually in the past, but this was the first time both together. It was one of the most intense musical experiences that left me exhausted just listening. Then last Sunday it was good to see that musicinverness's afternoon concerts are starting to attract an audience, and especially for a work as great as Dvořák's Cello Concerto in the composer's own arrangement for cello and piano. My warmest thanks to Stephen Laidlaw and Ailsa Aitkenhead for sourcing and presenting this wonderful piece of music for us. But, let's look forward to September.

the solo part in two works by Antonin Dvořák and the concert ends with that composer's Czech Suite in D major, crammed with beautiful melodies.
