Friday 3rd March at 1.00pm in St Stephen's Church, Inverness. In a joint promotion with Live Music Now Scotland, musicinverness welcomes **Tree O'Reeds**, a wind trio of Ruaridh Bakke (clarinet), Will Gold (bassoon) and Gaynor Gowman (oboe) that was formed during the Covid lockdown while they were all students at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. Their programme for this sixty minute lunchtime concert features works by Beethoven, Grieg, Ibert,
