I have always believed that skilled cooking is a creative art and top of my September list has to be my lunch last Sunday in excellent company at 63 Degrees Restaurant in Manchester to celebrate my 77th birthday. Yes, the wrinkles have begun to show!

But let's look forward to October with lots of Schubert coming up (and even more in November).

Sunday 1st October at 3.00pm in Inverness Cathedral. The Cake and Concert Series. Schubert: Cello Quintet in C major, D.956. Schubert's only full-fledged string quintet, it has been praised as "sublime" or "extraordinary" and as possessing "bottomless pathos," and is generally regarded as Schubert's finest chamber work as well as one of the greatest compositions in all chamber music. Simon Evans, Ellis Ash, Jon Rutter, Ian Sharp and Kate Ellingson play this magnificent work. Admission £10.

Tuesday 10th October at 11.00am for 11.30am in Nairn Community and Arts Centre. The Arts Society Highland Lecture. IMPRESSIONIST GARDENS: their origins, significance and influence by Patricia Andrew.

This very colourful lecture looks at both the gardens painted by Impressionists, and the many gardens created by them – in some cases, one and the same thing. The artists to be discussed include Monet - with his famous water gardens - and Manet, Pissarro, Renoir and Sisley. There are other gardens in the paintings of Cézanne, Bonnard, van Gogh and Gauguin, and related garden influences in the work of Gustav Klimt and John Singer Sargent.

Dr Patricia Andrew has been a curator of museums and galleries, and Deputy Director of the Scottish Museums Council. She is now a heritage consultant, and a lecturer to a wide range of organisations including the National Galleries of Scotland and their Friends. Her publications include numerous exhibition catalogues, and articles in academic and general journals; her book *A Chasm in Time: Scottish War Art and Artists of the Twentieth Century* (2014) won the Saltire Society's 'Scottish History Book of the Year' award. She is an art and garden historian, and also a hands-on gardener with an allotment.
